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I.

INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC), and in compliance with Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Hieta's June 15, 2015 E-mail Ruling, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) submits this Case Management Statement. The Ruling directed SCE to file and serve a Case Management Statement identifying the following information: (1) any issues parties have settled, including relevant citations to the parties' prepared testimony; (2) all remaining contested issues; (3) an estimate of cross-examination time and the proposed order or witnesses; and (4) any other relevant matters.

SCE sent an email to all parties on June 10, 2015 requesting cross estimates, which were due to the ALJ by June 12, 2015. California Coalition of Utility Employees (CCUE) and ChargePoint responded directly to SCE while Environmental Defense Fund (EDF), the Utility Reform Network (TURN), and the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) responded to the whole service list with their cross estimates on June 12, 2015. Of the parties who responded,

only ChargePoint did not request hearings. SCE compiled all parties' responses in the spreadsheet attached hereto as Appendix A.¹

II.

DISCUSSION

A. Issues Parties Have Settled

As of the date this Case Management Statement is being filed, SCE and various parties, including the Office of Ratepayer Advocates and The Utility Return Network, are conducting settlement negotiations regarding all aspects of Phase 1 of SCE's Charge Ready Application, including the following issues:

- The amount of the charging station rebate;²
- The ratemaking mechanism for the charging station rebate;³
- The Charge Ready Advisory Board;⁴
- Reporting requirements;⁵ and
- The regulatory process for approval of Phase 1 and Phase 2 of SCE's Charge Ready Application.⁶

SCE has noticed a settlement conference for June 25, 2015, after which SCE and various parties plan to file a motion requesting Commission approval of the settlement.

B. Remaining Contested Issues

SCE hopes that the ALJ will suspend hearings to save parties' resources while they move towards a settlement agreement. However, if hearings move forward on June 22, parties have requested time to cross-examine witnesses on the following issues:

- The importance and amount of the charging station rebate;
- The ratemaking treatment of the charging station rebate;
- The role of the Charge Ready Advisory Board;
- Data collection / reporting requirements;
- The regulatory process for review of Phase 1 and approval of Phase 2;
- Cost-effectiveness;
- Marketing, education, and outreach; and
- Program design including rate structure and reward mechanisms.

C. Estimate for Cross-Examination Time and Proposed Order of Witnesses

SCE compiled all parties' estimates for cross-examination in the spreadsheet attached hereto as Appendix A.⁷ Parties provided cross-examination estimates that total about 6 hours of hearings, or approximately 1 day. However, given that ChargePoint witness Colleen Quinn is not available on June 22, SCE suggests holding hearings on both June 22 and June 23.

SCE has not conferred with parties on the order of witnesses. Unless any parties suggest otherwise, SCE suggests the proposed order of witnesses attached hereto as Appendix B, which schedules SCE witnesses to be cross-examined on June 22 and other witness to be cross-examined on June 23.
