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NOTICE OF *EX PARTE* COMMUNICATION**

Southern California Edison Company (“SCE”) hereby gives notice pursuant to Rule 8.4(a) of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) of the following communication.

**DATE AND TIME OF COMMUNICATION:** February 26, 2020; 3:00 p.m. to 3:40 p.m.

**LOCATION:** CESA 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Market Development Forum; 2150 Allston Way, Berkeley, CA

**NAMES AND TITLE OF NON-CPUC PERSONS PRESENT:** For SCE, Carla Peterman, Senior Vice President of Regulatory Affairs, Southern California Edison Company.

**NAMES AND TITLES OF CPUC PERSONS PRESENT:** Commissioner Liane M. Randolph

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF COMMUNICATION:** Ms. Peterman delivered a keynote speech regarding electrification and energy storage where Commissioner Randolph was in the audience. Ms. Peterman described SCE’s Pathway 2045 whitepaper, which explains SCE’s vision for meeting California’s ambitious climate change goals. Ms. Peterman explained that the Pathway is based on: (1) using 100% clean electricity, (2) electrifying 75% of transportation, (3)

electrifying 70% of buildings, and (4) using low-carbon fuels for technologies that are not yet viable for electrification.

Ms. Peterman also discussed SCE's belief that eighty gigawatts of new utility-scale clean generation and 30 GW of utility-scale energy storage will be required in California in the next 25 years, and potentially more as gas-fired power plants retire and peak load shifts to later times of day. Ms. Peterman also discussed issues related to grid resiliency and examining how microgrid projects may play a role in providing community resilience for areas impacted by Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS). She noted that customers affected by any PSPS or wildfire events could use SCE's website to shop for portable battery power equipment and noted that SCE had set aside certain funds for energy storage in high fire risk areas. Ms. Peterman discussed the filing of SCE's 2020-2022 Wildfire Mitigation Plan, which includes system hardening solutions such as covered overhead conductor and increased sectionalization of the grid to reduce the customer impacts of PSPS events. Ms. Peterman noted that SCE is prioritizing investments in the grid in areas most impacted by PSPS, including by planning for micro-grids and back-up generation.

To enable the Pathway and storage, Ms. Peterman noted the need for agreement and collaboration at the state and stakeholder level on a decarbonization plan that enables development of renewable energy, storage, transportation electrification, and building electrification, and a plan that acknowledges how these areas are coordinated, and coordinated action advances the affordability of the transition. For storage in particular, Ms. Peterman noted a need for system and reliability planning, procurement, and grid integration rules that can sustainably accommodate the scale of storage needed. Ms. Peterman also noted a need to continue to evolve the rules regarding how resources will interconnect and interact with the grid.
