Subject: A.19-08-013 SCE 2021 GRC, I.18-11-006 SCE-2018 RAMP: SCE Prehearing Conference Procedures

To Administrative Law Judges Wildgrube and Seybert:

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) is writing to you and to the GRC Parties as a follow-up to your March 13, 2020 email regarding procedures for the Prehearing Conference (PHC). That PHC is currently calendared for March 24, 2020.

As a general matter, SCE believes that the issues germane to the PHC can be considered submitted via the PHC Statements, and that the actual PHC can be tabled in light of the current health and safety crisis facing us all. If the Commission wishes, Parties could be given an opportunity to file short replies to the PHC Statements, in lieu of the discussion/oral argument that would normally occur at the PHC. To minimize the burden on all stakeholders, SCE suggests that these replies be limited to identifying and addressing “misrepresentations of law, fact or condition of the record contained in the comments of other parties.” *Cf.* Commission Rule of Practice and Procedure 14.3(d) (addressing replies to PD comments).

If, after consideration of the written submissions, the Commission still feels that the PHC should go forward, SCE would be supportive of a telephonic PHC that utilizes the procedures that Commissioner Randolph and Administrative Law Judge Tran issued on March 18, 2020 in Rulemaking 20-01-007. Those detailed procedures for a telephonic PHC were issued in connection with a PHC that is also scheduled for March 24, 2020.

If the PHC goes forward, SCE believes that all parties should appear remotely. Beyond the obvious health and safety concerns, no party should be disadvantaged by having to appear telephonically while other parties (who are not required to travel or whose organizations still permit travel under the exigent circumstances) can appear in person. And no party should have to feel any pressure to travel in light of the current circumstances.
